Meeting Held on 16-01-2020



Minutes of Meeting

1. The bio-medical waste management committee members were encouraged to be conversant with all aspects and processes of bio-medical waste management being done in Bhota Hospital.
2. Familiarity of the members to current practices in BMW Management is required to maintain quality control of all the processes.
3. Mr. Ram Krishan pointed out some problems in leave management and general discipline among house keeping staff.
4. To address this issue it was unanimously decided that leave applications of all the housekeeping staff should be routed through Mr. Ram Krishan to avoid any lapse in biomedical waste management.
5. It was also pointed out that sometimes there is delay in delivering bio-medical waste from hospital to the onsite storage area. To address this issue Dr. R.K Kanwar advised to deliver the biomedical waste daily to onsite storage irrespective of the quantity generated. The same was agreed by Ms. Bandna Kumari, Nursing Sister for immediate compliance.
6. Ms. Atrika Kumari, Nursing Sister was advised to update the Hepatitis B and Tetanus Immunisation record of Healthcare workers.
7. As a part of bio safety Good Bio Medical Waste Management is required to ensure safety of patients, visitors and other people in the surrounding localities.
8. To meet above requirement we should be very meticulous about disinfection and sterilisation of Bio Medical Waste.

9. CBMWT contractor should collect the Bio Medical Waste every 48 hours from Bhota Hospital. In case there is delay in such collection both the contractor and the HP State Pollution Control Board should be informed telephonically as well as via e mail. Mr Ram Krishan, Supervisor (Housekeeping) ensured that the same was being followed without fail.
10. Safe storage of Biomedical waste should be ensured at all the times. The onsite storage space should not be accessible to un-authorized persons.
11. Regular training programs are being conducted for newly inducted staff to make them aware about BMW Management Rules and procedures at the induction to avoid any mistakes. In addition it was reiterated by Dr. R.K. Kanwar to include old staff in same training to update their knowledge and skills.
12. All employees likely to be deputed to medical wing should be immunised before deputing to ensure their safety.
